why should i serve?

what does a true follower of jesus look like?

How does one measure that? Should you consider church attendance, number of Bible studies, small group participation, Bible verse memorization, leadership in church activities? Sometimes, unintentionally, these become the ways we measure our growth.

a good way to tell if you are growing as a follower is to look at what concerns you.

Are the concerns of Christ becoming your concerns? As followers of Jesus, we are called to look more like our Lord, to become more like Christ in heart and action. So, as we grow, our concerns become more like the concerns of Christ. If someone were to ask you, "What concerns God? What does God care about?" how would you answer?

If Christ were to walk around in your world, what would He care about?

The Bible helps us understand the concerns of Christ for this world. We can read that God is concerned about...

- His glory and worship
- Justice and mercy and the furthering of His truth in our world
- The needs of people and the situations in which they live
- Children, and His followers becoming like them in order to enter the kingdom
- The unity of believers within local communities and throughout the world
- The nations of the world coming to know him as Savior and Lord

the important thing is to get involved.

Serve at DBC, serve our neighbors in our community and serve the nations in our world. As you serve, pray that the Spirit makes the concerns of Christ your own. Pray that you become more like Christ as a result of serving.

Doing good things is not an end in itself. Serving is not the primary goal. We want to be more like Christ. We want the concerns of Christ to be our own. When this happens, the world will be drawn to Christ because of the love they see between us and for others.

Sunday Morning Hospitality: Provide light refreshments for approximately 70 students at 9:45 am.

Chaperone: Chaperone summer retreats, mission trips, day trips to Braves games, Six Flags, etc.

Bus Driver: Transport students in DBC's buses for off-campus events.

Prayer Team: Agree to pray for a specific student and the Student Ministry throughout the school year

children's ministry

Small Group Leader (Shepherd): (Sundays, 9:45 am during the school year; relaxed summer schedule) Facilitate discussion and activities for a group of 8-12 children by looking at passages of Scripture, asking questions to help grow their understanding, showing them how the Bible relates to their lives and spending time in prayer. Leaders facilitate activities that reinforce Scripture memorization or the key point for that week's lesson.

Registration/Guest Services Team: (Sundays, 9:45 am) Responsible for welcoming parents and children, greeting visitors, facilitating child check-in, answering informational questions and facilitating child check-out at the conclusion of the Kid's Place Rally time.

Tech/Video Team: (Sundays, 9:45 am) Help set up sound, lighting and all behind-the-scenes needs of Sunday morning worship in the Kid's Place Rally Room. Occasionally works with lock-ins, musical performances and VBS.

Mission Project Coordinator: Coordinate mission projects for kids in grades K-5.

JAM Team Leaders: Facilitate activities and teaching for K-2nd graders during The Eleven (monthly rotation).

preschool ministry

Small Group Teacher: (Sundays at 8:30, 9:45 & 11 am) Work with a specific age group ranging from two years old through Pre-K; responsibilities include building relationships with children, facilitating discussion, story-telling and general classroom management and care; training is provided.

Floater Team: Provides backup when small group teachers are out.

Tech Team: Run sound and media during Sunday Morning Rally time; volunteers commit to a monthly rotation.

Registration/Guest Services Team: Greet visitors as they enter the preschool or nursery building and direct them to age-appropriate classes; ensure all volunteers are accounted for and assist teachers as needed.

Palace Pals Special Needs: Volunteers are paired with a special needs child in the Sunday School room and are specifically trained to meet the child's needs in an inclusion setting during the 11 am worship hour. Palace Pals builds a relationship with the child and helps the child participate in the Sunday School setting.

Nursery Care Givers: (Sundays at 8:30, 9:45 & 11 am) Care for babies 8 weeks - 2 years old (monthly rotation).

Kid's Choir Team: (Wednesdays from 6-7 pm during the school year) Help children ages 4 - 5th grade learn songs, dance moves and spoken dialogue for two performances; facilitate drama activities that are fun and help children grow as confident performers and responsible worship leaders; work to instill in the children a heart for missions and a love of performing through worship; extra rehearsals held before performances.

Greeter: Help newcomers feel welcome and ensure a friendly, helpful reception for each person who comes to our campus so they will want to return; all positions require being in place at least 20 minutes prior to the beginning of the worship service or Bible study; rotating schedules available.

Parking Lot Greeter: These volunteers have the important task of being the first people newcomers meet when they get out of their cars and set the tone for guests' experience at DBC.

Connector: Maintain personal contact with newcomers to ensure meaningful connection into a group.

Usher: Ushers are called on to pass out programs before the service; manage any needs in the lobby before each service such as setting up chairs; pass the offering plate during the service.

Phone callers for guest follow-up: Make in-office phone calls to offer a warm greeting to guests who filled out a Connection Card. Work a few hours each month on a Monday, Tuesday or Wednesday.
